Southern Health Working Group

Following a recent meeting of the above group I have summarised the key issues raised by members. These issues will be tabled at the Special Council meeting on 22nd March 2021.

To allow those who may not be able to attend this meeting to be fully informed on the matters raised, I would be grateful if you forward your response in writing by 16th March 2021.

- The community, especially in rural areas are reporting that they are finding it
 even more difficult to get a GP appointment now than pre Covid-19, which in
 turn could lengthen the time for a referral appointment from the Trust. I am
 writing to the Health and Social Care Board on this matter but would also ask
 that you raise this matter with them.
- It is believed that the waiting times for appointments and treatments within the Trust have increased due to Covid-19. The working group members would appreciate an update on the current waiting list situation and would like to know if there are plans to make a substantial financial investment to abate such going forward.
- As the Covid-19 vaccination programme continues have the Trust considered large scale vaccination centres in more local locations as the community are reporting that they are finding it very difficult to get to the major sites, such as Craigavon Area Hospital.
- 4. Members of the community have reported that access to the Covid-19 testing centre in Middlebank Newry is difficult to get to for people with mobility issues. Can better access be given to those who have mobility issues?

- 5. There are many scare stories about the Covid-19 vaccine in our communities. Members of the working group would like to know how they can help counteract these stories and ensure that residents of the District receive the vaccine.
- 6. Can you provide an update on how Daisy Hill Hospital is coping with the changes to systems due to Covid-19 and any difficulties that have arose in operating such?

I look forward to your response on these matters.
