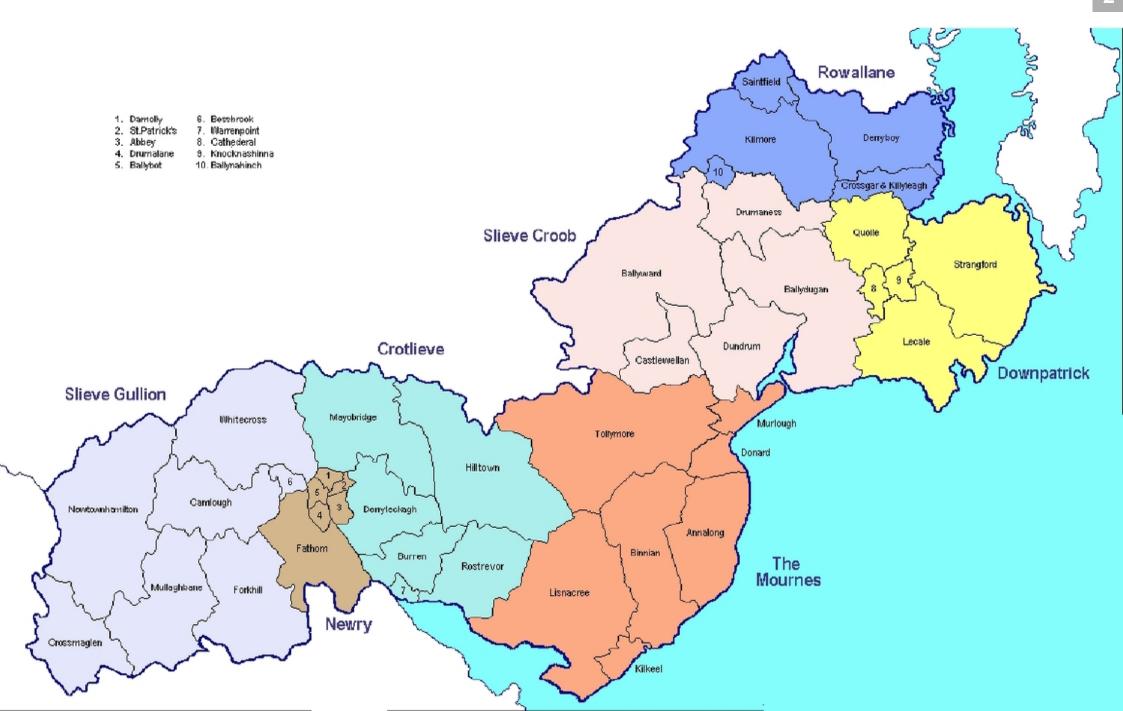

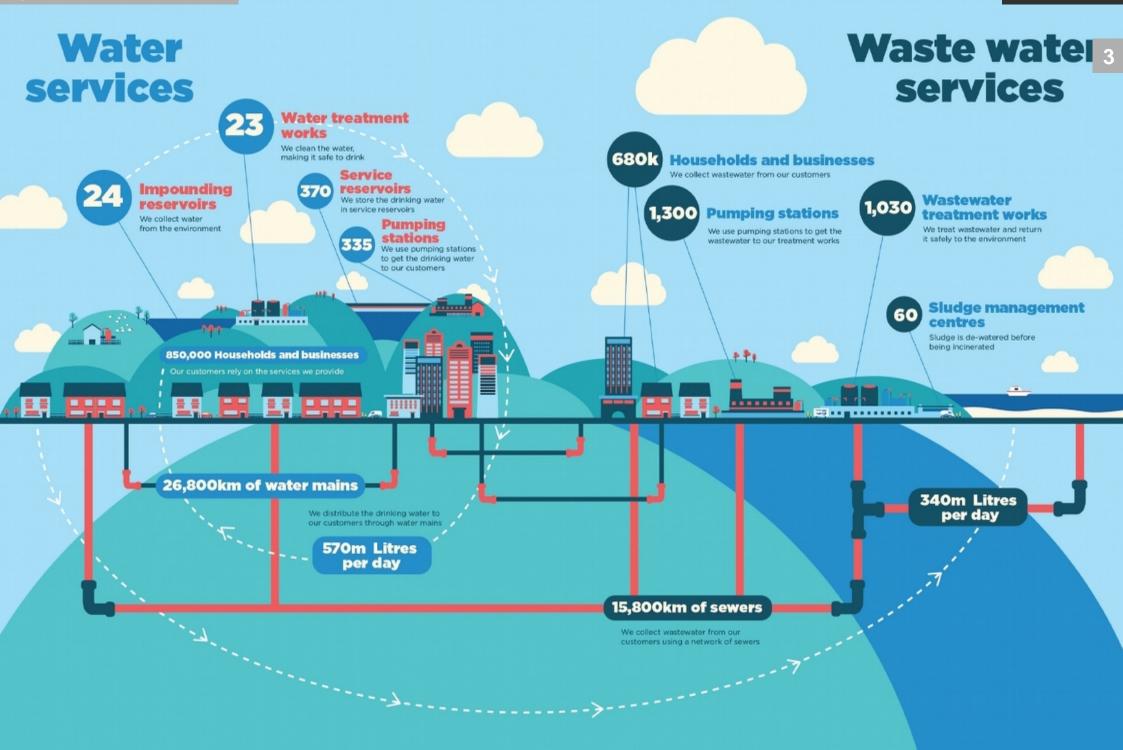

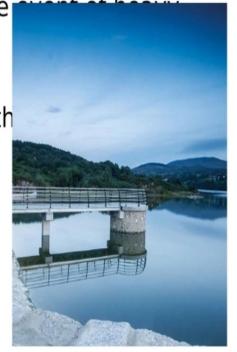

## Camlough Lake

- NI Water recently completed a major programme of work worth £3m at Camlough Lake – full co-operation with the Council and other stakeholders.
- This project will improve the facility to provide an enhanced recreational resource for the area.
- Reservoir embankment strengthened to provide extra security in the rainfall.
- Valve tower constructed to control water flows.
- Designed to further enhance the lake as a major leisure site within th
- Featured on front cover of NI Water's 2016/17 Annual Report.





### Mourne Wall

- Ongoing refurbishment of a 2.5km stretch of the Mourne Wall built in early 20th Century by the Belfast Water Commissioners in the High Mournes.
- Intended to define boundary of Water Commission land NI Water is the successor company.
- Wall crosses 15 peaks and took nearly 20 years to build.
- Highly experienced local stonemasons carrying out the work under NI Water supervision.
- Some of the work will be undertaken in areas where there is no readily available natural stone in these circumstances, carefully controlled helicopter drops in agreed areas will provide the material.

# Silent Valley

- As well as producing 140m litres of water per day, Silent Valley continues to be the jewel in NI Water's crown in Newry, Mourne and Down.
- 3 family fun days have been hosted at the site during the spring and summer months, in cooperation with the Council. 1000+ attendees at each.
- Significant programme of ongoing investment to improve the infrastructure of the site, including recreation of part of the 'Watertown' site, which existed during the 1920s' as the dam was being constructed. The village was

### A Decade of Delivery

- In 2017, NI Water marks ten years of delivering what matters for our customers.
- Water and wastewater treatment sites opened to the public included Camlough Lake, Drumaroad WTW and Fofanny WTW.
- Local representatives and others visited the sites in the spring to learn more about what NI Water does.
- Drumaroad WTW supplies 140m litres of water per day to customers from Silent Valley, with Fofanny supplying 52m litres from Spelga and Lough Island Reavey.





### Ex-Hurricane Ophelia, 16 October

- Amber Warnings for wind in place across Northern Ireland.
- Silent Valley and Spelga Dam closed as a precaution.
- Bronze reaction team stationed at Newry depot in preparation.
- NI Water on full alert precautionary major incident.
- Co-operation with Councils and other stakeholders meant that the situation was kept under control from NI Water's perspective.
- Briefing reports issued to full range of stakeholders throughout
- Incident stood down early on 17 October useful exercise for N
- Grateful for co-operation and goodwill of the Council.

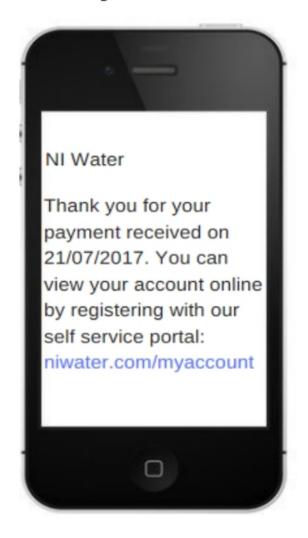

### **Texts - Payments received**

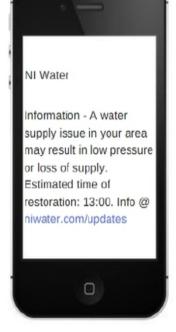
