

Recycle Glass in your Blue Bin

Glass Recycling Guide



Glass Bottles and Jars only.

YES (clean and dry)

- ✓ **Bottles of any colour** (eg wine, beer, spirits)
- ✓ **Jars** (eg sauces, jam, baby food)
- ✓ **Non food bottles** (eg perfume, aftershave, face creams)

good to know

Other types of glass do not melt at the same

temperature as bottles and jars. If they enter the glass recycling process, it can result in new containers being rejected.

NO

- ✗ **Ceramics** (eg crockery)
- ✗ **Drinking glasses**
- ✗ **Glass cookware** (eg Pyrex)
- ✗ **Light bulbs and tubes**
- ✗ **Microwave plates**
- ✗ **Mirrors**
- ✗ **Nail polish bottles**
- ✗ **Vases**
- ✗ **Window glass**

Please dispose of these items in your black bin or at your local household recycling centre.



What goes into your Blue Bin



Your blue bin is for dry recyclable materials. All items must be clean, dry and loose. Please do not place items in plastic bags. No food, liquids, plastic bags or any non-recyclable waste.



TOP TIP
Remove recyclable caps and lids and place separately in the blue bin



TOP TIP
Pop lids back inside the tin



Glass Bottles and Jars



Metal Cans and Aerosols



TOP TIP
To save room stack pots, tubs and trays together



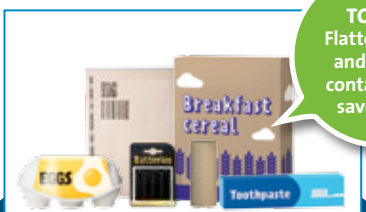
TOP TIP
Remove any plastic wrapping before recycling



Plastic Bottles and Containers



Mixed Paper



TOP TIP
Flatten boxes and squash containers to save space



Cardboard



Cartons

Don't forget glass and other recyclable materials **MUST NOT** be placed in your black bin. All food waste **MUST** be recycled in your brown bin.
